Author, Marcie Lynn has always been involved in several ministry opportunities in her local church. When she found herself single again after many years of marriage, her passion turned to singles seeking God's will for their relationships. She was a single mom raising her two sons, Ryan and Joshua in the small town setting she knew as a child. She desired a devotional that she could use in new relationships and was unable to find one on the market. So, guided by the Holy Spirit, she set out to write one. *30 Days—A Devotional for New Relationships* is the result of that endeavor.

Since writing and publishing this first book, Marcie has married. Marcie and her husband, Chris, worked through this book and the yet unpublished books she has written. They found that it has helped them to learn a lot about one another and their Christian beliefs. She has also used this book with a close friend and found that even as the author, she was able to discover new things about herself as well as share a new found closeness with her friend.

### About the Book

When Marcie originally wrote this book, she envisioned it being used by couples who had just met each other or had just started to date. After the book was published, she was greatly surprised at how the book was being used. It seems God had greater plans for this book. The book has been used as a curriculum for a youth/young adult Sunday School, by couples married 5, 20, and 40+ years, by individuals, by friends, and in many other ways.

The title of the book: "New Relationships" is still applicable, however the type of relationships has changed. This book has brought "New Relationship" with God as people use it to discover more about God's Word. It has brought "New Relationship" with individuals as they have discovered things about themselves. And it has brought "New Relationship with others, whether it is with a dating partner, spouse, sister, brother, or best friend.

## Keynote Topics

### **Purpose**

To bring the message of Loving God, Loving Others, and Loving Yourself and the importance of each of those relationships.

### **Presentation**

Marcie can develop a presentation unique to your venue, or you can choose from one of the following presentations.

**The Orchard Presentation** - Four types of relationship are discussed:

- The relationship of the Soil based on Matthew 13:3-8 which is Relationship with God
- The relationship of Fruit based on Matthew 7:16-20 which is the Relationship with yourself.
- The relationship of Seeds based on Mark 4:31-32 which is the Relationship with others.
- The relationship of the Orchard based on 2 Corinthians 6:14-18 which is the Relationship with the Body of Christ
- These relationships are summarized by Matthew 22:37-40 and 1 Corinthians 12:27.
  - You have to love and know God, in order to fully know and love yourself.
  - You have to love and know yourself in order to fully know and love others.
  - You have to love and know others in order to fully share God.
  - You have to love and know the body in order to fully be a part of Christ's body.

**Entering the House of God** - The Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6:9-13 is discussed in relation to the layout of a house:

- The Living Room (Our Father, which are in heaven, Hallowed be thy name ...) where we crawl up on God's lap and **adore** him.
- The Study (Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven) where we learn God's will and **align** with it.
- The Kitchen (Give us this day our daily bread) where we learn to change our greeds and wants into our needs by **asking** God to supply those needs.
- The Bathroom (And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors) where we dump the things of the flesh and **accept** the washing in the blood of Jesus.
- The Recroom (And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil) where we work out to prepare for battle against the enemy and where we wrestling with God to prepare for God's answers and how to **apply** them.
- The Front Door (In Jesus Name) **acknowledging** that when Jesus left the tomb, he left the door wide open. Whoever knows and loves the Son of God, is an heir to the throne with Him and welcome in God's house all the time.

## The Love Triangle - Love tends to come in triangles:

- **Father/God - Son/Jesus - Holy Spirit (1 John 5:7)**
  - Titus 3:4-6, God loved and because He loved He sent Jesus, His Son. He allowed His Son to be the sacrifice for all our sins. Because Jesus loved, he was willing to bear that heavy burden. Because he died, we are renewed by the love of the Holy Spirit. Because the Holy Spirit came to dwell in us, we have a direct connection to God
- **God - Husband - Wife**
  - Ephesians 5:33 The man who puts God first and becomes more like Christ, loves himself and is better able to love his wife. The more he loves his wife, like Christ loved the church, the more his wife will be able love him. The woman who puts God first and becomes more like Christ, will love herself and will be free to submit to her husband.
- **God - Parents - Children**
  - Ephesians 6:4, 9, The man who puts God first and becomes more like Christ will walk as an example of Christ and will be a reflection God's love. The child that watches their parent walk as an example of Christ and reflect God's love tend to imitate that example and will find it easier to love God.
- **God - Believer - Unbeliever**
  - 1 Thessalonians 1:8, As a Believer puts God first and becomes more like Christ and walks in His ways, he is observed by the unbeliever. The unbeliever watches and gains respect for the believer, then begins to imitate the believer which leads him right to Christ.
- **Father/God - Son/Jesus - Is your triangle really closed?**
  - Romans 8:12-16 There are many people who accept that God loves them and claim that love, yet they do not reflect that love or do not accept Jesus as part of that love. There are many who accept Jesus, yet do not reflect his love and his walk. They absorb it and keep it for themselves. They in essence are only accepting only two parts of the original triangle ...
  - Are you a true follower of Christ? Or not? Galatians 5:16-26

**Jewel of a PMS Relationship** - Discovering that by doing as God commands, we can become a Perfect 10 and a Signet Ring.

- Discussion of the relationships found in Matthew 22:37-40 intermingled with information related to PMS (Pre-Minstrel Syndrome).
- P stands for People (Proverbs 31:10)
- M stands for Myself (1 Timothy 2:9-10)
- S stands for Savior (Titus 2:10 (b))
- We are the Signet Ring in the PMS Relationship, which makes us more valuable than any other jewel. (Haggai 2:23)
  - By loving people I become a signet ring far more precious than any other jewel and valued far above rubies or pearls.
  - By loving myself, I carry myself in such a way that my good deeds make me become a signet ring far more beautiful than those decorated with gold and pearls. This allows me to love people better.
  - And by loving my Savior and following His ways, I become a Signet Ring, chosen by God. As such, I represent and carry the authority and mark of our Father the King of kings. And because of the love of my Savior, I can better love myself and love people.
  - I have a PMS relationship because I am Christ follower.
